STOP! PLEASE, PLEASE STOP!



With the expansion complete, Natures Resort no longer has only a lollipop road. (A main road with a circle, or rectangle, at the top) Now there are three roads leading to and from the gate with intersections where they meet the rectangle. We also have an east/west road that intersects the main entrance road and the north/south road on the west.

Towards the end of last season, as the new roads came into use, we had a couple of boops+ moments as two vehicles met each other at an intersection. As we do not want an

boops+ moment to turn into an accident, we have put up some STOP signs.

The owners do not like stopping at stop signs any more than you do, but we felt that this was an absolute necessity for the safety of us all. Much thought was given to where these signs should be placed with the following goals in mind:

- Safety
- As few Stop signs as possible
- A uninterrupted route for bikers

The criteria above have been met, and there are now six stop signs around Natures. Although the roads at Natures are private driveways, and the stop signs cannot be legally enforced by traffic police, we expect everyone to be responsible, and to respect and obey the signs that are there for the safety of all of us. These stop signs apply to ALL vehicles . including golf carts and bikes.

If you do not want to deal with stop signs there is a route around the park without stop signs . but remember, THE SPEED LIMIT IS **FIVE MILES AN HOUR**, so it might take you a while to circumvent the park!
