Memorial Weekend Picnic

Summer Projects are Starting!

The first of our summer projects was to sealcoat the black top roads in the 'old' section of Natures with the same sealcoat that was used on the main road last summer. Once again we had to ask our Natures Family for their patience and understanding while we work to keep Natures looking good, and once again, without exception, everyone has taken the inconvenience in their stride.

The first step was to clean the roads. This meant running a street sweeper which created a dust storm and succeeded in blowing gravel on to all the driveways. What a mess! Fortunately everyone heeded the warning to keep their windows closed, so the dust storm remained outside. The pools, however, needed a really good cleaning!

Next came the sealing of cracks and patching areas where pot holes could be starting. This process took more than two days!

The final step was to apply the sealcoat – and this was when the weather stopped cooperating! Dry, calm days are needed for sealcoating. And this was when the rain that we had been waiting for for the past three

months, came! And so did the Texas wind! Even more frustrating was the fact that each time, before they could start work on any section, they would have to blow the roads clean again, creating more dust!

Eventually the work was completed, and now the roads look almost new. We do not expect to have to do any further road work for at least a couple of years.

When Natures was built the Carriage House was originally designed as a storage area
