Some summers, like last summer when we rebuilt the showers and bathrooms and built a new Pool Hall, the projects are exciting and very visible. However, many summers the projects that we tackle are the sort of things that only get noticed when they are NOT done and things start to look run down or get shabby.

This is to be one of those 'not exciting' summers. We are getting a jump start on some of the smaller projects, like thinning out the Bird of Paradise which was doing its best to block the office door. This was a tricky operation as we had to be careful of electric and phone cables in the ground! We chose to do this while our Winter Texan family was still here so that we could share the plants with those who wanted them.

Another project was pressure washing the clubhouse. This is a totally unglamorous job that is never noticed. However, if it were not done the clubhouse would certainly start to look dingy.
