Summer Projects

Every summer we have a list of projects that we tackle while there are the fewest number of people in the park in an effort to inconvenience the least amount of people. Unfortunately this does mean that it is the same folks who are inconvenienced year after year! We thank our residents for their patience and understanding over the years.

Although this year's projects do not have the "Wow" affect that previous projects have had, they are nevertheless just as important as we strive to keep Natures looking good.

1. Guest Room Deck:

The first project was to check the structural integrity of the guest room balcony, and to replace the old deck.

After Richard researched the various materials that we could use, it was decided to use composite boards that should not have to

be replaced for many, many years. The noise and mess was kept to a minimum, and it did not take long to get the new deck constructed. The boards match the green trim of the building, so it blends in well and looks great.

After the deck was completed, Denny worked on covering the underside of the deck again. Instead of using soffit material which was used previously, he used siding so that when it rains we should have a dryer area under the deck. Many thanks Denny for all the hard work and the great job you did!

2. Repairing Roads and Sealing the Main Driveway

Trying to inconvenience people as little as possible, damaged areas in the roads were patched, and the main driveway was again sealed with a strong rubber sealer which should keep this heavily used road in good repair for the next few years.

Maintaining our roads is an ongoing process. It is one of those unglamorous projects that go completely unnoticed unless you are here to witness the work. However, if

it was not done and the roads fell into disrepair, people would certainly notice potholes and Natures would lose its tidy, well cared for look!

3. Cementing the Entrance

Over the years we have patched and repaired the entrance road from Monte Cristo to the gate, but with the huge amount of traffic especially all the heavy vehicles, the blacktop was just not holding up. It was decided that this area should be cemented. Because of the high volume of traffic going in and out of the gate, months ahead of time this project was scheduled to be done in May when there would be fewer people in the park.

Unfortunately, May was also the time when Mother Nature threw us a curve ball, and our carefully scheduled project now clashed with the urgent unscheduled project of getting the fence rebuilt after the Storm of May 12th. Because the cement contractor had other commitments, we had no option but to continue on as planned. Having both of these projects going on at the same time was quite a challenge, but with Richard overseeing both of them it all went amazingly well. Thank you Richard!

The tile ceiling was replaced with a sheet rock ceiling with additional insulation. While we were making a mess with sheetrock it seemed the right time to also do the Library ceiling! Better lighting was added to the bedrooms and bathrooms and the walls were given a fresh coat of paint.
