Monte Alto

Over the holidays we adopted 8 families with a total of 26 children from infancy to 13 years of age. During the past few weeks many boxes of food were filled to overflowing, children's names were checked off the lists, and wrapped gifts appeared in the clubhouse. Our Natures Resort family was also generous with their monetary gifts, which enabled the Monte Cristo Project organizers to purchase any shortfalls of food items or children's gifts plus give each child \$5 in cash, and each mom a \$20 gift certificate.

We are grateful to the Monte Alto Social Service staff who gather the information required to ensure that our help goes to those who need it most. Although the whole process, from getting information to delivering the gifts and food flows very smoothly from start to finish, it only does so because of all the behind the scenes work being done. A very big thank you to the organizers and their helpers for the time and effort that they put into making this such a success, and to all of those who contributed in any way to the program.

This year Santa Clause (Tom, Lot 302) took time out of his busy schedule to accompany those delivering the gifts and food. He was a huge hit with all the kids as he gave out hugs and candy canes and the looks of joy and surprise on the faces of the younger children was awesome.

Days for Girls - Another worthwhile project!

This past summer, Pam, Lot 303, ran across a program called Days for Girls. She became involved and mentioned the program to some of the quilting ladies at Natures. Her enthusiasm and the basic concept sparked the interest of the quilters, and they decided that they would also like to become involved. As word has spread more of our Natures family have joined in.

Celeste Mergens, the founder of Days for Girls, discovered that in many poor countries girls had no resources to cope with their monthly periods and were thus forced to stay home from school on those days. This has far reaching consequences. Besides it negatively affecting their schooling, which, in turn, affects their earning ability in their adult life, it also leads to sexual abuse and unwanted pregnancies.

The goal of Days for Girls is to teach girls about feminine hygiene, (many thought that they had AIDS when they started their menstrual cycle), and provide each girl with a kit containing the sustainable supplies they need in order to manage their periods and stay in school. These kits are designed to last for three years, which will give the girls 180 days of schooling that they would otherwise have lost, and this in turn will play a part in breaking the cycle of poverty!

If you are interested in learning more about this program, come to Crafting in the Corner on Friday afternoon (12:30 to 2:30 in Richard's Pool Hall) and you will be able to see the kits that are being made. Each kit costs approximately \$10 to produce, and contains washable, reusable flannel menstrual pads, waterproof cotton liners, 2 pairs of panties, a wash cloth, soap, and 2 Ziploc freezer bags. (The freezer bags enable the girls to wash their supplies with very little water.)

The quilters have committed to making 125 kits this winter which will be shipped to Lusaka, Zambia, so they would welcome any help both with making the kits (there are sewing and non-sewing 'jobs') as well as monetary gifts to help defray the cost of

materials. Days for Girls is a non-profit organization, and donations are tax deductible. Receipts will be provided for donations over \$20.
